ILA Educational Class Descriptions

ASSA ABLOY Key Wizard Software Workshop

Instructor: Lee Garver, DAHC

KeyWizard is a comprehensive key management software program that provides the facility with accurate information concerning keys, key holders, hardware locations, master key systems, overdue keys, and maintenance schedules. This class consists of hands-on exercises on how to get the software up and running quickly, upload and administrate doors and personal, plus how to assign, issue, and retrieve keys.

Maximum Class Size 25 (Laptop Required) **4 Hour Class**

Basic Locksmithing

Instructor: Gale Johnson

This is a hands-on class where you will rekey locks, learn the fundamentals of lock picking, practice picking locks, shim cylinders open, cut keys by code, duplicate keys, discuss the locksmith glossary of terms, adjust and maintain key machines.

Maximum Class Size 15 **8 Hour Class**

Basic Master Keving

Instructor: G.R. Zechman

We will discuss a glossary of terms so the participant can speak the language with colleagues. We will discuss single step versus two step progression. You will learn to develop a master key system or simply generate changes from an existing system. Finally, participants will learn how to pin standard cylinders and A2 small format interchangeable cores.

Maximum Class Size 25 **4 Hour Class**

Basic Safe Combination Changing

Instructor: Kurt Kloeckner, CJIL, TCPL

This class will teach you how to take a safe that's open with a unknown combination and find the existing combination or reset the safe lock to a new combination. You will learn the functions of the parts inside safe locks, and also how to do a key and hand change.

Maximum Class Size 15 **4 Hour Class**

Detention Hardware

Instructor: Robert Perry, DAHC/CDC, FDHI, CCS

What is detention hardware?

How does it differ from builders hardware?

This class will explain the difference using both a PowerPoint presentation and hands-on evaluation. Midwest Detention Systems of Minooka IL will be providing locks and other hardware items for use in this class.

Maximum Class Size 25 **4 Hour Class**

Detex Electrified Hardware Installation & Servicing

Instructor: Carl Dean, AHC, CDT

Attendees will have the opportunity to install and wire up the various Detex electrified exit devices. Products include: battery alarm, hard wired alarm with remote annunciation, motorized latch retraction, delayed egress exit device, combination latch retraction with delayed egress, and electrified trim.

Maximum Class Size 12 **4 Hour Class**

Detex Low Power Operator Installation & Servicing

Instructors: Scott Peck & Carl Dean, AHC, CDT

This class will allow attendees to participate and observe the installation of the Detex low energy operator. The session will then focus on the programming process. Installation will include the built-in latch retraction controller as part of the operator.

Maximum Class Size 6 **4 Hour Class**

Door Closer Installation & Maintenance

Instructor: Scott D. Baker, AHC, CDT

This class will help you to choose the correct door closer for specific applications, determine the proper mounting method of surface door closers, door closers for accessibility and life safety requirements, when to use a stop/holder type arm, brackets and drop plates, special applications for those problem doors, adjusting the sweep, latch, and backcheck valves to function properly, identifying an incorrect installation, and how to correct it. Review the principles of concealed closers and floor closers.

Maximum Class Size 25 **4 Hour Class**

Fire Door Inspection Requirements

Instructor: Robert Perry, DAHC/CDC, FDHI, CCS

How this effect your institution? Who does it? New language contained in NFPA 80 (Standards for Fire Doors and Other Opening Protective, 2007edition) requires annual documented inspections for fire-rated door assemblies. Chapter 5, Care & Maintenance addresses the requirements for these inspections for both new and existing fire-rated doors. This class will offer an overview of inspections requirements. Participants are required to have a copy of the owners guide published by DHI.

Hafele: Future of Access Control

Instructor: John O'Meara

This class will cover history of access control, new and current systems, and developments in the related technologies. Developments in electric locks, electronic controls, digital and biometric controllers and more. Will cover data storage, programming, offline and online communication, and review the DHI expansion of hardware consultant programs.

History of Locks

Instructor: Claude Hollyfield, DAHC

In this class you will discover the who, what, where, and when of major commercial lock manufacturers of today as we follow a timeline from the development of early locks to today's access control products. Do the names Corbin, Lockwood, Russwin, Sargent, Schlage and Stanley mean anything to you? We will also explore hardware names like DORMA, LCN, Norton, Rixson and Von Duprin.

How to Integrate SimpleK to your Existing System

This class will cover the preparing of existing data, modifying forms to meet the individual user's needs, inputting the new data into the system, manipulating the data, formulating reports, and creating new master key systems. The necessary software will be provided.

Key Control

Some basic tools will be reviewed to pin cylinders, cut keys, followed by instructions on securing and tracking the movements of these keys. By class end, each student will have a good understanding of how to track keys, the why, when, where and who has access to what in their facility.

This class will discuss biometric technology including the history and advancements; fingerprint, hand, face, iris, and vein recognition. 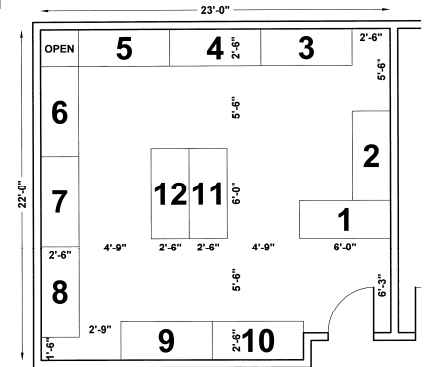

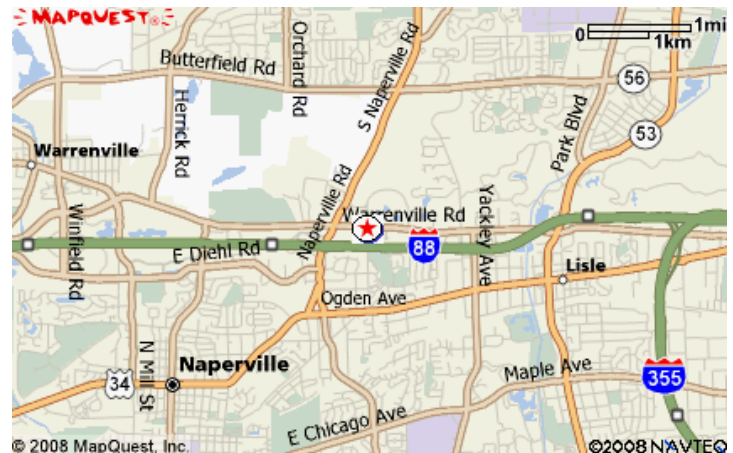
